JUST AS THE ASSOCIATION HAS CONTINUOUSLY REALIGNED ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE AND STREAMLINED PROCESSES FOR EFFICIENCIES, IT ALSO PERIODICALLY REVIEWS THAT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND ALLOCATIONS ARE REFLECTED APPROPRIATELY. IN 2018, THE NRA FOUNDATION UPDATED ITS ALLOCATION CALCULATION TO BETTER REFLECT THE REIMBURSEMENT TO THE NRA FOR GRANTS AND SHARED EMPLOYEES. THIS REEXAMINATION RESULTED IN AN INCREASE OF MANAGEMENT FEES AND A DECREASE IN GRANT DOLLARS PAID TO NRA. THE NRA FOUNDATION REIMBURSED MANAGEMENT FEES TO NRA OF \$13,083,925 AND \$4,968,055 FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2018 AND 2017, RESPECTIVELY. THE NRA FOUNDATION AWARDED GRANTS TO NRA TOTALING \$13,525,570 AND \$18,812,141 FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2018 AND 2017, RESPECTIVELY. WHILE THE MANAGEMENT FEE INCREASED FROM 2017 TO 2018, THE GRANTS AWARDED DECREASED, RESULTING IN TOTAL GRANTS AND MANAGEMENT FEES PAID TO NRA OF \$26,609,495 AND \$23,780,196 FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2018 AND 2017, RESPECTIVELY.
